What is the challenge?

It's the ultimate golf challenge to raise money for Cancer Council. A team of four players take on four rounds of golf in one day and ask friends and family to sponsor them.

What is involved?

The team will tee off at dawn, probably do the first two rounds fairly quickly, then play on until they finally complete that 72nd hole. Their friends and family might want to come and cheer them on.

When is it?

On or around 16 December – the longest day of the year. This is so they can make the most of the sunlight hours.

What is it for?

Cancer Council is internationally renowned for innovative work in cancer research, prevention and support. Our mission is to prevent cancer, empower patients through providing information and support, and save lives.

What scoring system is used?

Participants play under the Stableford method and may also request carts. It's up to the club whether they provide carts for free or charge a fee.

Some clubs have donated the fees to the teams' fundraising page.

How can the club help?

Waive green fees for all participants – they are taking on the ultimate challenge and raising funds to help people impacted by cancer.

On the day support?

It's recommended that the club make an announcement on the day to advise members that participants are taking on Cancer Council's The Longest Day challenge, playing 72 holes in one day to raise funds to help those impacted by cancer.

Members should give right of play to participants of the challenge to ensure they can get through the four rounds of golf before sunset.
